Export diversification still in slow lane

Bangladesh's plans aimed at diversifying export baskets are yet to bring about the expected results as the priority sectors are not enjoying most of the benefits promised in the Export Policy for 2021-24, according to entrepreneurs. This means the garment sector continues its domination in the national export basket: apparel shipment accounted for 84.50 per cent of the country's overseas sales in the July-March period of the ongoing financial year. When the government unveiled the new Export Policy, it identified 14 sectors as the most priority ones considering their immense potential.

The sectors included high-valueadded denim items, manmade fibres, garment accessories, pharmaceuticals, plastic goods, footwear (leather and non-leather), leather goods, jute and

and processed agro-products, fruits and ceramic products; value-added frozen cut flowers, and light engineering products (auto-parts, bicycles, motorcycles



and batteries). In the services sector. software, informational technology and IT-enabled services, and freelancing have been recognised as the most priority sectors. Eighteen sectors have been named as special emerging sectors, diversified jute goods, agri-products including electric and electric goods;

foods; printing and packaging; cut and polished diamond and pieces of jewel-

ry; paper and paper products; rubber and rubber products; woollen goods; handicrafts; and lungis and handloom products. Tourism and architecture engineering and consultancy services have been named as special emerging sectors as well. When the policy was made public, the government promised a number of financial and other supports for the sectors to facilitate

their growth, with a view to enabling them to contribute to more job creation and industrialisation, thus accelerating economic development.For instance, the sectors are supposed to receive project loans at reduced interest rates, rebates in income tax, subsidies when it comes to utility ▶see page-2

90% of adolescent girls, young women don't use internet in low-income countries: Unicef

Around 90% of adolescent girls and young women do not use the internet in low-income countries, while their male peers are twice as likely to be online, according to a new Unicef analysis published Wednesday.

The report, titled "Bridging the Digital Divide: Challenges and an Urgent Call for Action for Equitable Digital Skills Development", by Unicef was published on the occasion of International Day of Girls in ICT.

It takes a close look at the genderbased digital divide among young peoyears, based on the analysis of available data on internet use, mobile phone ownership, and digital skills in mostly low-, lower-middle-, and some middle-income



economies. The report finds that girls "are being left behind" in an increasingly digital and connected world. According to the report, girls are the least likely to have the opportunities to develop the skills needed for 21st-century learning and employment. Girls are 35% less likely than their male peers to have digital skills, including simple activities like copying or pasting files or folders, sending emails, or transferring files, the Unicef report said. However, the report also notes that it's not just enough to bridge the digital gap by ensuring access to the internet."Closing the digital divide between girls and boys is about more than just having access to the internet and technology. It's about empowering girls to become innovators, creators, and leaders," Unicef Director of Education Robert Jenkins said in a statement."If we want to tackle gender gaps in the labour market, especially in Science, Technology, Engineering

Lowest transit fee set at Tk 589 per tonne for Indian goods

Bangladesh will charge at least Tk 589 for the transportation of a tonne of Indian goods to the north-eastern states from the mainland of India through Mongla and Chattogram ports as Dhaka offers regular transit facility to the neighbouring country. Apart from the transit fee, there would be a charge for using the roads of each kilometre and it would be Tk 1.85 per tonne, according to a gazette of the National Board of Revenue (NBR) issued on Monday. The document processing fee would be Tk 30, the security charge has been fixed at Tk 100, the administrative fee would be Tk 100, and the transhipment fee has been set at Tk 20 for each tonne in each shipment. The escort charge for each container, truck, trailer, or covered van would be Tk 85 per kilometre. A certain amount of fees for the electric lock and seal will also be paid, it said. bills, and bonded warehouse facilities.

The sectors are expected to get loans at reduced rates and airlines are expected to ship their products on a priority basis. Assistance is to be extended to exporters so that they can market goods, explore new markets and attract foreign direct investment, according to the export policy.

It also said special campaigns will be conducted to raise Bangladesh's exports in Southeast Asian and Latin American nations, while preferential trade agreements will be signed with major trading partners so that the country continues to enjoy duty benefits after it becomes a developing nation from a least-developed country in 2026.

A halal certification authority will be established to tap the opportunities of the \$2-trillion global market for Shariahcompliant products.

MA Razzaque, research director of the Policy Research Institute of Bangladesh, says the export policy is not a legally binding document.

"The government may promise a lot in the policy, but many of the pledges might not translate into reality for various reasons," he said, urging the government to formulate an action plan to execute the policy successfully.

Md Saiful Islam, president of the Metropolitan Chamber of Commerce and Industry, thinks if the government wants to export \$80 billion worth of goods annually, it needs to diversify products and markets.

"Bangladesh needs to produce hi-tech products like semiconductors to achieve the export goal. This is because a lot of work orders are shifting to other countries from China due to geo-political tensions not only for garment items but also hi-

The potential of the blue economy needs to be exploited and the bonded warehouse facility needs to be extended to other sectors, he said.

The garment industry enjoys the bonded warehouse facility, which allows apparel manufacturers to import industrial raw materials and capital machinery duty-free to produce

products for the western markets.

The government is already looking for alternatives to cash incentives on exports since the country will not be able to pay direct cash assistance to exporters after graduation, according

Recently, Senior Commerce Secretary Tapan Kanti Ghosh said the commerce ministry has a plan to write to the finance ministry for bringing at least 10 more sectors under the bonded warehouse facility to give a boost to exports from the upcoming fiscal year.

The commerce ministry also plans to incentivise four high potential sectors, except the garment industry, that have already fetched at least \$1 billion in export earnings

"The government will continue the cash incentives for eligible sectors up to 2026 so the export industry remains competitive," Ghosh told The Daily Star over the phone.

Some 536 British nationals have been evacuated from Sudan on six flights, the Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office said.

The chairman of the Nigerians in Diaspora Commission confirmed to the BBC that evacuations of stranded Nigerian students in Sudan had started. It is thought there could be up to 5,000 Nigerians living in

Sudan, and that 3,500 of them are students. However, a UK-born student in Sudan said she did not

have enough petrol to get to rescue flights. Samar Eltayeb, 20, from Birmingham, has been sheltering

with a relative outside Khartoum since fighting began. The third-year medical student at Sudan's National University has been waiting to be evacuated to join her par-

ents and siblings in the UK.

'We have have no gas, and the petrol stations are empty," Ms Eltayeb said. "There'll be constant flights within the next few days, but if I can't find gas to get there, then I'm stuck." Buses carrying evacuees are continuing to leave Khartoum

despite soaring prices of fuel and bus tickets. Meanwhile, former Sudanese politician Ahmed Haroun said that he and other former officials are no longer in jail.

The Sudanese army said Bashir was moved from the prison to a military hospital before the fighting erupted.

two top litchi-producing destinations are in fear of weaker

Usually, litchi trees start blooming by the end of March and the time between flowering and fruit formation is very important. But this year, drought occurred at that crucial peri-

A litchi farmer, Raza Hossain, told The Business Standard, "I have 400 litchi trees in my orchard and I kept nurturing them when the trees started blooming".

"Despite the care, 40% of the litchi pods have already fallen from the trees and now I am trying to protect the rest by sprayıng water," he added.

Another farmer, Quddus Biswas, said, "I have ten litchi orchards and I failed to spray water regularly in my orchards due to lack of water in the adjacent canals because of drought. Now I am in fear of losing all the litchi pods if adequate water is not managed".

Due to intense heat and drought, gutis [mangoes on setting stage] were falling from the trees in Rajshahi, which is the top mango-producing district in the country. However, rain occurred in Rajshahi on 24 April and in Chapainawabganj on 26 April, in a very first of the season – offering blessings to the mango farmers.

Abdur Razzak, a mango farmer in Rajshahi, told TBS, "I have an orchard of 1,000 mango trees. Persisting hot weather and drought have affected us badly as the mangoes were falling from the trees. The rain two days ago helped the mangoes a lot and showed us hope of a satisfactory yield".

"Although we have lost a lot of gutis [mangoes on setting stage] already, even if no other disaster comes then we will get a good amount of yield to address the loss, said the optimistic farmer," added the optimistic farmer.

Meanwhile, industry experts have expressed their concerns about the impact of persisting hot weather on summer fruits.

"If the current situation persists, it may lead to a significant decrease in production, resulting in a shortage of these fruits and an increase in prices in markets," warned renowned agricultural economist Professor Dr MA Sattar Mondol.

The country's mango and litchi production not only caters to domestic demand but also has a significant export market. Keeping it in mind, the government has taken various initiatives to support the farmers during these challenging times, including providing subsidies for irrigation methods and agri-

Meanwhile, the Bangladesh Agricultural Research Institute (BARI) has developed drought-tolerant mango and litchi cultivation methods, by which fruits can withstand such adverse weather conditions.

"We have developed some cultivation guidelines for the farmers and have already given it to the ministry. Following those, farmers can cope with changing climate-saving production" said Dr Babul Chandra Sarker, chief scientific officer at the fruit division of BARI.

British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak is being investigated by parliament's standards watchdog over whether he properly declared his wife's shareholding in a childcare company which stands to benefit from new government policy. Parliament's Commissioner for Standards began the investigation over a "declaration of interest" on 13 April, according to a list of open inquiries on its website on Monday. Opposition parties had raised questions over media reports that Sunak's wife Akshata Murthy was a shareholder in a company set to benefit from support for the childcare sector announced in

The investigation is an embarrassment for Sunak, who came into office in October promising to lead a government with integrity "at every level" as he sought to revive his party's fortunes ahead of a national election expected next year.Sunak and Murthy are the richest ever occupants of 10 Downing Street. Murthy is the daughter of one of the founders of Indian IT giant Infosys and owns about 0.9% of the company.
