



PM urges global leaders to stop the war

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday called upon the global leaders to stop the war, saying the women and children are the worst sufferers of the war. "We don't want any war. Not being a woman politician or a prime minister, as a mother, I am calling upon the world leaders to stop the war, stop the game of arms and the arms competition" she said. The prime minister said the world has been witnessing the war -- firstly the Russia-Ukraine war and now Israeli attack on the Palestine. She said this while addressing a gathering of the women entrepreneurs and leaders of women organisations of the ruling Awami League (AL) at her official Ganabhaban residence here following the inauguration of the Joyeta Tower in city's Dhanmondi area. The premier said the women and children are the worst sufferers of the war, referring to her grave experience of being

Pakistan army's captive along with her mother, only sister and three brothers during the War of Liberation in 1971. "I had the experience of the dreadfulness of the war," she said, adding that she was pregnant while she was captive under Pakistan army. "We had no furniture and we were not confirmed whether we would get food to eat at that time," she said. At the function, Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman's younger daughter and Prime Minister's only sister Sheikh Rehana was present. Sheikh Russell Day today

Sheikh Russell Day will be observed in the country tomorrow in a befitting manner coinciding with the 60th birthday of Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman's youngest son Shaheed Sheikh Russell. Russell, also the youngest brother of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, was born on October 18 in 1964 at the historic Bangabandhu Bhaban at Dhanmondi road number 32 in the capital. But he was brutally assassinated along with most of his family members, including his father Bangabandhu, on August 15, 1975 when he was a student of class four at University Laboratory School.

The Cabinet Division in 2021 declared October 18, the birthday of Sheikh Russell, as 'Sheikh Russell Day' under the category "Ka". To mark the day, government bodies, ruling Awami League and its associ-



ated bodies and different socio-cultural organizations will observe various programmes at national and international levels. The day will also be observed at Bangladesh missions abroad while different TV channels will air special programmes highlighting the significance of the day tomorrow. Sheikh Russell was named after Bangabandhu's favorite writer,

renowned philosopher and Noble laureate Bertrand Russell, by Bangabandhu himself and Mother Sheikh Fazilatun Nesa Mujib, according to government website <https://sheikhrussel.gov.bd/index-en.html>. Very active and playful from a very early age, Russell was light of the family. However, life didn't remain playful. He had to face the harsh cruelty of life from the age of one and half, when he had to visit Dhaka Central Jail and Dhaka Cantonment just to meet his beloved father. From cruelty, life soon became merciless. In 1971, he himself became an inmate of Dhaka Central Jail, just at the age of seven. Youngest of the family, his world revolved around his father Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, mother Sheikh Fazilatun Nesa Mujib, sisters Sheikh Hasina and Sheikh Rehana and brothers Sheikh Kamal and Sheikh Jamal. Russell was assassinated along with his family members in a domestic and foreign conspiracy on the night of 15 August, 1975. He was then only a student

Skilled manpower should be groomed for furniture industry: Commerce Minister

Special Correspondent: Commerce Minister Tipu Munshi today said there is no alternative to create skilled manpower in the country for the development of any sustainable industry including the furniture industry. "It is possible to earn a lot of foreign currency through exporting local furniture made by trained manpower," he said. The Commerce Minister said this while addressing as the chief guest at the opening ceremony of the five-day "18th National Furniture Fair" 2023 organized by the Bangladesh Furniture Industry

Owners Association at the International Convention City Bashundhara in the capital. Noting that the furniture sector of Bangladesh has become a strong sector in a very short period, Tipu said the locally-made furniture is being exported abroad. The quality, design and modern shape of the country's furniture will surely draw the attention of any country in the world and thus, they would be interested in purchasing the furniture, he added. In this context, he said that the ready-made garment industry sector has not reached the current

position in a single day. Currently, he said that furniture worth \$110 to \$120 million is being exported abroad annually while the volume of furniture exports would play a significant role in the country's overall export earnings in the coming days based on the revolutionary changes brought in this sector over the last one era. The Commerce Minister expressed his firm resolve that it is possible to earn a lot of foreign exchange through exports if sustainable furniture industry is developed side by side it is also

Nine dengue patients die, 2,609 hospitalised in 24 hrs

Staff Correspondent: Nine patients died and 2,609 were admitted to different hospitals in the country during the last 24 hours till 8 am today. On September 20, Bangladesh witnessed 21 dengue deaths, the highest in a single day this year, and the nation also saw the same highest figure on September 2. "The death toll from dengue infection crossed the 1100-mark as the authorities recorded 1,190 dengue deaths between January 1 and October 16 this year," a press release from the Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS) said. "During the period, 561 dengue patients were hospitalised in Dhaka city while 2,048 were admitted to different hospitals outside the capital city," the DGHS daily statement added. "This year, 1,190 deaths, the highest in a year since dengue was detected in 2000, were reported from dengue disease while 281 died last year," the statement said. With the new cases, the total number of patients rose

Mobarek and Joyeeta Foundation Managing Director (MD) Afroza Khan were also spoke. A video documentary on the activities of the Joyeeta Foundation and construction of the Joyeeta Tower was screened at the function. The prime minister earlier in the morning inaugurated the 12-storey Iconic Joyeeta Tower on one bigha of land involving Taka 168 crore in the city's Dhanmondi area to help empower women economically. She also visited the Jamdani Gallery and Joyeeta Marketplace housed in the tower. The Joyeeta Tower was constructed with the state-of-the-art infrastructure to ensure women's economic empowerment by involving them in various business ventures under the Joyeeta brand. The government had already allotted one bigha of land in each division at a token price for the Joyeeta Foundation. About inauguration of the Joyeeta Tower, Sheikh Hasina said they have built the tower to help grassroots' women market their products easily and thus become self-independent economically. "We had earlier established the Joyeeta Foundation to empower women financially," she said. She quoted Bangabandhu as saying that "the women empowerment is possible if they achieve economic independence through earning money for themselves". She also recalled the contribution of her younger sister Sheikh Rehana to helping women become entrepreneurs. Briefly describing the measures taken by her government for women welfare, she said her government is doing everything possible to empower and develop women from the grassroots. "We have introduced the system of reserving posts for the women in union, upazila and district councils mainly to explore women leadership from the grassroots," she said. She said they have introduced the system of incorporating the name of mother alongside the father in giving identity of their children replacing the old one that only required father's name. The prime minister said Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman had given the country the constitution within nine months of the country's independence which guaranteed equal rights of the men and women. She said there was the provision of reserving 15 seats for women in the constitution which is now elevated to 50 seats. "Bangabandhu always believed in women empowerment. He reserved seats for the women in the parliament to flourish the women leadership," she said. She continued that Bangabandhu had first appointed women in judiciary and police as the country can't achieve progress leaving women, accounting for

half of the population, at home. The prime minister said she later appointed women as judges of the apex court alongside posting women as superintendent of police and deputy commissioner despite opposition. Being appointed as the first women SP, Rawshan Ara held dacoits risking her life and proved that women can work successfully in any position, she said. She also said the women have to realize their rights with their own education, talent and skill without depending on mercy from others. "You (women) have to place your position by your own works based on education, wisdom and skill," she said, adding, "It will not be possible to secure your position by only shouting for rights." The premier expressed her satisfaction saying the women now attained their own position in every step of the society by utilising their talents. She called upon the women to bring every inch of land under cultivation against the backdrop of the global economic recession and rise in inflation. "We have to grow our own food. So, grow whatever you can by utilising every inch of your fellow lands," she said. The prime minister said her government had transformed the country into a developing and digital nation with their round the hours' hard works and pragmatic and specific plans. "Now the world considers Bangladesh as a model of development," she said. She asked the women folk to be vigilant as none can hinder the ongoing development works. She reminded the countrymen that the BNP-Jamaat clique had destroyed the country by making it a free ground for militancy, terrorism and corruption. The prime minister said they are now on hot pursuit to turn Bangladesh into a developed, prosperous and Smart Bangladesh by 2041. Sheikh Hasina called upon the countrymen to vote her party to power again in the upcoming general election to sustain the country's development. "The people of the country got freedom by voting for the boat (AL election symbol). Today, Bangladesh got the status of a developing country because it also voted for the boat," she said. The premier said that Bangladesh is now witnessing democracy as her party is in power.

Mujibur Rahman's youngest son Shaheed Sheikh Russell. Dr Hasan said, BNP knows it very well that they will not be able to go to power through election. Their ultimate goal is to hatch a conspiracy to topple Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, he said. The information minister said BNP and Jamaat become extreme Muslims when poll comes, giving different statements against Awami League. But, BNP and Jamaat are not concerned about the real problem of Muslims. They are actually taking side in favour of Israel, brutality and war crimes, he added. Hasan Mahmud said, BNP leaders remained silent when innocent Palestinians and children are being killed like birds. They are silent in fear of annoying big powers- that means they are in favour of Israel, he said. Urging the BNP leaders including Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir not to act as the leader of 'lathiyal bahini' of Begum Khaleda Zia and Tarique Rahman, the minister said, "please act as a politician... do work for the country." Hasan said, Mirza Fakhrul after being elected as a lawmaker in 2018 election, his supreme leader barred him from taking oath. All BNP lawmakers were forced to resign from the parliament at their directives. In fact, Hasan Mahmud said, Begum Zia and Tarique Rahman don't want that the other leaders of the party (BNP) to go to election and elect as lawmaker. The minister said it is not possible to topple the government by holding rallies or forming human chain. Their same attempt went futile in 2013 and 2014, he said. Hasan said, the government of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina is pledged bound to hold a free, fair, neutral and transparent election. People of the country would take part in the next election with enthusiasm, he said hoping that BNP will also take part in the poll. Earlier, the minister paid glowing tribute to Shaheed Sheikh Russell and prayed for eternal peace of the departed soul. He said Russell was brutally assassinated along with most of his family members, including his father Bangabandhu, on August 15, 1975. Dr Hasan said if Sheikh Russell had been alive today, he could have contributed a lot to the national life. But the killers did not spare him, he added. He said, killing of Russell will remain as a heinous crime in the history. The trial of the killers has been done, but it is not sufficient. The masks of kingpins of the brutality including Ziaur Rahman should be exposed, said Hasan. No matter how much I answered his call, he would bury his face in his mother's shoulder saying, "You're my Abba!". It seems that he is upset with me. He no longer wants to take me with him when he leaves." In 1971, Russell and his family, including his mother and two sisters, were imprisoned in a house on Dhanmondi, road No. 18. His father Bangabandhu was imprisoned in a jail in Pakistan and his two elder brothers Sheikh Kamal and Sheikh Jamal had gone to fight in the Liberation War. He was released on December 16, 1971, along with his mother, sisters and other family members. Russell came out of the house saying 'Joy Bangla'. Victory celebrations were going on out there. On the dark night of 15 August 1975, Sheikh Russell along with his family members was assassinated as a result of domestic and foreign conspiracy. He was then only a student of grade 4 of University Laboratory School.

to 2,44,698 the statement said, adding: "This year, some 2,35,284 patients were released from different hospitals out of the total patients." "A total of 8,224 dengue patients are undergoing treatment at different hospitals. Of them, 2,410 are in Dhaka while 5814 are outside of the capital city," it added. The authorities have recorded the highest number of dengue positive cases outside the capital in August this year, meaning the mosquito-borne disease gripped the entire country. August witnessed 71,976 dengue positive cases, the highest cases in a single month since dengue outbreak began in 2000 in the country while 342 dengue-related deaths were reported in the current month, the DGHS statement said. According to the health experts, the vector-borne disease hit Dhaka city in 2000 subsequently the dengue positive cases were detected in Dhaka city only. But the dengue disease is changing its nature and it is gradually spreading across the country, they said, adding: "All 64 districts of the country have witnessed positive dengue cases." "The authorities recorded 79, 598 dengue positive cases in September while 396 deaths from the mosquito-borne disease during the same period. The prevalence of dengue cases in Bangladesh has increased 10 times since last year and the deaths have increased almost thrice, according to a health expert. "Dengue positive cases have increased 10 times and death three times between mid-September, 2022 and mid-September, 2023," Professor Dr. Md Gola Sharower, head of Department of Entomology, National Institute of Preventive and Social Medicine (NIPSOM), told a seminar recently. The morphological, biological and behavioral changes that have occurred in Aedes mosquitoes as a result of all our unknown activities in mosquito breeding are highly favorable for Aedes mosquitoes to transmit dengue virus, he elaborated. According to the DGHS, Bangladesh reported 1,01,354 dengue cases, the second highest since dengue cases were detected in 2000, in 2019, 1,405 cases in 2020, 28,429 cases in 2021 and 62,382 cases in 2022. It also added that Bangladesh

recorded 179 dengue related deaths in 2019, seven deaths in 2020, 105 deaths in 2021 and 281 deaths, the second highest deaths, in 2022.

Switch to eco-friendly EV era Electric vehicles purchase stalls


Buying electric buses for public-sector transport fleet stalls as the Planning Commission has turned down the procurement project not backed up with fund confirmation from the Indian Line of Credit (LoC), officials said. "Since BRTC (Bangladesh Road Transport Corporation) has not enclosed any types of project loan confirmation or even

assurance documents from the lender, India, we have not proceeded it for approval," said a senior PC official on Monday. The commission sent the proposal back to the Ministry of Road Transport and Bridges (MoRT&B), he added, thus putting the buy on the back-burner. The ministry had sent a Tk 10.36-billion project of the BRTC to the PC for getting approval for procuring 100 electric double-decker buses with the estimation of a major share of Tk 7.88 billion (US\$74 million) from India under its LoC-III lending scheme. "But the BRTC has not enclosed any document of the project loans or any concrete correspondence with the lender, India, for financing the project. As per government rules and regulations, we cannot proceed without getting confirmation of the source of funds for any project," another PC official said. BRTC proposed a Tk 10.36-billion project to import 100 double-decker EV buses from India with necessary spare parts and procurement of 7 electric charging stations to run those coasters. By December 2025, the BRTC wants to set up the charging stations and mobilize the 100 EVs for plying the streets in the capital city, where a traffic chaos has been entrenched for the run of outmoded smaller-sized buses and other commuter vehicles. The proposed project happens to be government's first initiative to step into the EV era in Bangladesh, as the world is in the cusp of switch to environment-friendly transportation. Bangladesh's public transport sector is heavily dependent on fuel oils and CNG, which emit carbon. A MoRT&B official says the BRTC will procure the EV buses to cut dependence on the fossil fuels and reduce the carbon emission that causes environmental pollution. When asked, the PC official said they would reconsider BRTC's LoC-supported project if the state-run transport corporation recasts the project proposal with the fund confirmation from the lender. The BRTC is also working to set up some other EV-charging stations across the country through some other grants from development partners in the process of change. In another project, BRTC and BRTA had proposed setting the up of seven EV-charging stations across the capital city. Under the United Nations Development Fund (UNDP)-supported Technical Assistance project, the transport authority and the corporation will set up seven other charging stations at a cost of Tk 22.02 million. The project, titled "Bangladesh enabling electric vehicles adoption (BEEVA) in the framework of sustainable energy-based transportation", has recently been placed for PC seal of approval. Besides, the BRTC is also going to take up another Tk 1.39-billion-cost project with the financial support of Korea, MoRT&B officials said. Under the proposed project, it will set up EV-charging station at different places in Dhaka city and its adjacent areas.

Industrial output index dives amid inflation, fist-tightening

Major production sector in Bangladesh slips in rebound from a global upset as the country's industrial-output index showed the deepest drop at the end of past fiscal year, with food, clothing, paper, and printing shrinking. Half of the large-scale manufacturing (LSM) industrial sectors in Bangladesh marked decline in June on a year-on-year (y-o-y) basis, according to data prepared by the Bangladesh Bureau of Statistics (BBS) in IMF-prescribed new methodology. The government agency prepares the data under the IMF's system of national accounting (SNA) meant for use in the measurement of the GDP. It prepares the data for 22 large-scale industries of Bangladesh which have around 11-percent contribution to the gross domestic product or GDP. In June, 11 large-scale industry-output indexes dropped deeply over the same month a year earlier, the BBS data showed. Even the LSM had better in May as the 13-sector group swung to growth that period over its corresponding period. Economists have raised concerns about an economic slowdown caused by record inflation and import restrictions which they believe are key reasons behind such performance in production. Commenting on the latest figures, former lead economist at the World Bank Dhaka office Dr Zahid Hussain says, "The inflation and import restriction on raw materials are two major reasons behind it." He also includes the tightening of monetary policy as well as administrative measures to curtail imports among the drags. These measures coupled with challenges of inflation, and energy shortfalls have resulted in the contraction of the LSM output. "It is important to ease the severe dollar liquidity crunch by increasing inflows and maintain a realistic exchange rate so that manufacturing is not disincentivised," the economist says about what deems as a way of breakthrough. The main contributors to the YoY decline were the manufacturing of food products which had a 16.6-percent index drop, RMG (5.0 per cent), paper and paper products

printing and reproduction of recorded media (dropped by nearly 16 per cent), manufacture of chemicals and chemical products (13.3 per cent), pharmaceutical products and pharmaceutical preparations (5.3 per cent), computer, electronic, and optical products that dropped 16.3 per cent and electrical equipment, having 6.2-percent contraction. On the other hand, the beverages sector showed a steep climb by 150 per cent, textiles rose 18 per cent, the manufacture of other non-metallic mineral products rose nearly 35 per cent and the manufacture of basic metals by 19.7 per cent, according to the BBS data. On the hefty growth of the beverage sector, Dr M. Masrur Reaz, chairman of the Policy Exchange of Bangladesh, says this is due to choking climate-change effects. "We have now the longer period of hot weather, leading to large sales of the soft drinks in the local market," he told the. Import restrictions have contributed to the poor output-index performances. Inflation has eroded the purchasing power of many which trimmed the demand for goods, Dr. Masrur said. Syed Nazrul Islam, first vice-president of BGMEA and managing director of Well Designers, told this correspondent that the overall orders from garment buyers remained poor since May last. This poor demand is because of the long persisting of inflation in the Western economies, he says about the country's main export-earning industry. Anwar-Ul Alam Chowdhury Pervez, a former president of the BGMEA or Bangladesh Garment Manufacturers and Exporters Association, says: "Actually there were inflated figures of exports-now the central bank asks us about the lower inflow of export proceeds." He said the Bangladesh Bank asked them why US\$3.0 billion worth of export proceeds did not come in the country. "Actually there were inflated figures of exports, and simply for this reason, this mismatch of export receipts," he clarifies their position on the claimed non-repatriation of full export earnings.


